The image still haunts me - a young girl walking towards a dirt path that leads into the woods - trees surround the path - you can't see beyond the trees, you can't see where she's going.



We saw this image on the video one night during VBS. A young African girl heading off to school after she spent many hours doing her chores before she began the journey of many miles. I can't imagine what she is feeling as she heads into what

appears to be the unknown. The dense trees allow no light to illumine her path. Who knows what animals or creatures lurk in those trees. What challenges or dangers might she encounter on her journey?

She appears to have great confidence and faith as she walks upon the path. She trusts that she will not be alone ... she has faith that her God walks with her. She walks with a smile on her face and hope in her heart.

Can you imagine having such faith and such joy? We go about our lives, going down the paths placed before us, not knowing what we will find, what challenges or dangers we may encounter. When we are faced with uncertainties and challenges, do we continue to go forward, trusting that we are not alone, trusting that God is walking with us, or do we quickly retreat back into the comfortable, the safety and security of what we know, of what we have control over, holding on to what we have?

... oh, ye of little faith ...

If only we could have such faith and trust as this young girl.

As a congregation we are discerning where God is calling us, we are listening to the Holy Spirit swirling around us, and we are being asked to follow Jesus down the path to new missions and ministries.

The faithful folks who are part of our Forward: Fearless and Faithful team and Stewardship for All Seasons team, along with the council, are engaged in discerning the future – which path(s) are we being called to follow and what resources do we need to navigate the path.

Together, we are being invited to join the faithful, to put our trust in God rather than in ourselves, and to boldly step forward.

We are standing at the beginning of that dirt path, looking into the trees, ready to take those first steps, trusting that whatever challenges and dangers are placed along the way, we will not face them alone, God will be there with us giving us the strength, patience, abilities, courage, and resources to follow the call of the Holy Spirit with open minds and hearts ... we go *forward, fearless and faithful!*

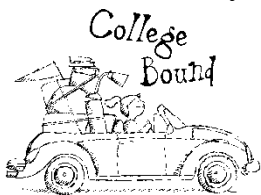

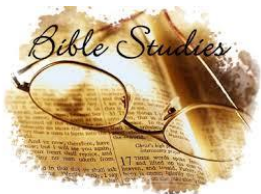

Wednesday morning Bible study meets at 9:30 in the Library. September brings ... we'll find out! Our study includes sharing, reflection, and lots of conversation. No previous knowledge or experience required!



School of Theology

The La Crosse Area Synod School of Theology gets rolling again in September. The school offers a variety of courses on Bible, theology, church, and mission. This is good stuff!

Classes are held at Our Savior's (*right in your neighborhood!*) for six consecutive Thursdays from 5:30-9 PM, in the fall, winter and spring. Over two+ years you can finish the entire curriculum. Cost is \$50/term, or \$20/course, plus any books. Classes are taught by synod pastors and qualified lay persons. There are no grades or exams, just some reading and a minimal amount of writing. You learn what you want to learn, at your pace!

An Introduction to the Bible course, taught by Pastor Len Liptack, is also offered, free of charge, for all new students *and anyone else who is interested*. The Intro will be on Thursday, September 12, from 5:30-9 PM at *English Lutheran Church in La Crosse*. To register for the intro course, contact the synod office at 788-5000.

Classes for the fall term begin September 19. Courses this fall include Gospels (Pastor Mark Kvale), Christian Theology I (Pastor Anne Hokenstad), and Worship (**Pastor Jon**).
