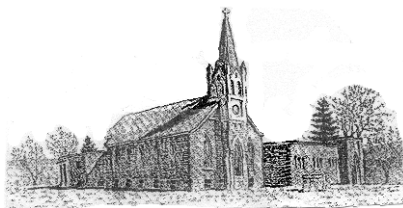

Ready to rock and roll? *Stewardship is on the move!*



As is often the case, October is our “stewardship month.” Lots of stewardship flying around, and to be honest, it can be a bit overwhelming – especially this year. So, give me a moment...and let me see if I can “clear the air” for you.

Elsewhere in this newsletter are two announcements that have to do with stewardship. A special congregational meeting is set for October 13. Anytime you have a special congregational meeting, its big stuff. And then...our fall stewardship emphasis – this is even bigger!

That makes for a lot of stewardship talk. And maybe it’s a bit much. Might we have bitten off more than we can chew?

Maybe. Or maybe not. After all, stewardship is really about faithful living, or being disciples of Jesus. And that’s what God calls us to be – so can we have too much faithful living? Too much discipleship? Besides, our discipleship, our faithful living isn’t about how much we can chew – it’s about the Holy Spirit working within us. So let the stewardship abound – ***God is at work!***



Our stewardship proposals have three parts.

First, stewardship means using our financial resources wisely. The congregational meeting will seek authorization to spend no more than \$20,000 to convert the lighting in our building to all LED lights. We have around 500 bulbs, almost all of them fluorescent. We estimate that new LED lighting will last 15 years. We also estimate that we will save somewhere around \$2500 on electricity each year, and another \$1000 or so in maintenance costs (ballasts and bulbs) each year. Do the math. \$3500 per year...15 years...\$52,000...over 15 years we will save around \$32,000...or \$2000 per year.

Yes, we will spend some money, but we will save much more.
That is good stewardship!

But wait...there's more! ***Our stewardship is also caring for our world.*** We aren't just saving \$\$\$, we are making a difference for our environment. 50% of electricity in our area is coal fired. That's "greenhouse bad" – and that's global warming. A reduction in our electricity is good for the environment and God's creation. ***That is good stewardship!***



But wait...there is still more! We may be saving our world, but in the end, Jesus is saving us! And ***the third part of our stewardship is sharing the good news of Jesus.*** We are about Jesus and sharing God's grace with generations – with kids, with adults, with seniors, with people next door and people we have yet to meet. Our goal is simple – ***connect people of all ages with Jesus.***

This fall's stewardship emphasis is a bold venture to invite us to do even more of "God's work with our hands." We want to build bridges between generations and make disciples of all ages. Isn't that what God calls us to do?

How will we do that? First, we want to ***maintain our ministry excellence.*** Do you know all that we do as a community? Sunday School, confirmation, music ministries (a whole bunch), senior ministries (another whole bunch), youth ministries (yet another whole bunch), food pantry, summer lunch program, prayer ministries, community involvement, mission support, campus ministry...and even more...we do a lot of ministry, and we do it



well. We want to continue – and as new opportunities arise, we want to respond faithfully – "making disciples of all ages."

Second, our world is changing, and as one pastor observed, Sunday is no longer the best day for many people to worship. Wednesday night works better for a lot of folk. So...let's do it – ***let's make a really good Wednesday night worship happen!*** Let's pull together

musicians, with a different style of worship from the weekend. What would that mean for younger families and kids, and for those of all ages who find Sunday challenging? We can do it because we are “making disciples of all ages!”

And then...what if we could make the commitment to invest, really invest in young people? What if we ***could change our youth ministry from very part time to very full time?*** What if we had the resources to engage a FULL TIME youth and family ministry director? To work with kids, nurturing their faith and discipleship. To strengthen families, trying to raise kids in a rapidly changing world. To reach kids and families in the community, especially those who are not connected with a community of faith. More “making disciples of all ages.”

Now, ***that is good stewardship!***

Whew – that is a lot, I know. But I’ve been working with a good team...and we’ve been in consultation with the Congregation Council...and council members have had conversations in the congregation...and we are excited! We are excited because we are sensing that from light bulbs to ministries to kids and families – and most of all, to the good news of Jesus Christ – God is at work in our midst!

So, here’s the plan. A special congregational meeting is set for October 13 to consider – and act – on a proposal to change our lighting. Meanwhile, you will be hearing in a variety of ways about our stewardship emphasis. Pray – ***pray deeply*** – about your response to God’s many gifts of grace, and for the opportunities we have to maintain our ministry excellence, provide new worship opportunities, and connect even more kids and families with Jesus.

Because in the end, good stewardship doesn’t begin with you – it begins with ***God working within you!*** And trust me, God is at work!

Sunday School News

Sunday School got off to a lively start on Rally Day as we welcomed back students and their parents, our new 4K class, families new to Our Savior's, and our classroom grandparents. The sanctuary was filled with enthusiastic chatter before the children were sent off to meet their teachers, get their pictures taken, and get reacquainted with their classroom grandparents.

We invite children 4K through 5th grade to join us Sunday mornings at 9:15 a.m. as we learn about Jesus' life and love from our friends from *Whirl*, through our singing, and the lessons shared by our teachers.

Our Sunday School offerings this year will be collected for **Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR)**. Each week the classes will be adding bricks, windows and doors to our house as we help to rebuild shelter for those who have become homeless. Others will be adding the necessary items to fill the house. And still others will be helping to remove the garbage and rubble left behind from the storm. The Bibles will be presented to the students in worship the weekend of **October 19 & 20**.

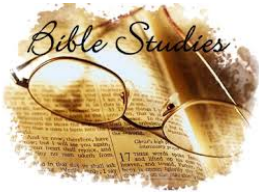

Special Congregational Meeting



A special congregational meeting has been called for Sunday, October 13, following the 10:30 worship service. This meeting will consider a proposal from the Congregation Council to refit the lighting in the building. The council is asking for authorization to spend no more than \$20,000 from the New Programs/Facilities fund to replace the current fluorescent lights with LED lighting. This is the only business that will be in order at this meeting.

Mission Endowment Fund Distribution



The Mission Endowment Fund will soon make its annual distribution, and it's looking for your help! We are seeking suggestions on ministries and community programs to support. Each year the fund shares approximately 4% of its value. We anticipate this year to disburse around \$16,000.

Recipients of support from the fund should be in one of three categories. You can get guidelines for suggested recipients from the office. The deadline for suggestions is Monday, October 14.

The Mission Endowment Fund began in 2004, and since then has distributed over almost \$200,000 to ministries here in West Salem and across the globe. The Fund receives designated gifts, and 70% of undesigned bequests. We are grateful for the generosity of those who years ago remembered Our Savior's and our ministry in their estate planning. They continue, even years later, to make a difference in the lives of people!

Lighting Project

The Congregation Council is proposing that we replace our current lights with LED lamps. Why? Because it makes “sense” ... and it makes “cents” – and lots of them!



Our fluorescent tubes consume 40 watts/hour. The new LED lamps consume 10 watts, a 75% reduction in energy use. Moreover, the LED lamps should last approximately 15 years. That means no new bulbs or ballasts for many years! We estimate electricity savings of \$2500/year, and maintenance savings close to \$1500/year. The project should pay for itself in five years! A great piece of stewardship – it makes lots of “sense” and “cents” and even “\$\$\$” ... and it is a great way to care for God’s creation!

On October 13 the congregation will be asked to authorize the project, not to exceed \$20,000. The quote we have received is just over \$15,000, so we do not expect to approach the authorized amount. The funds would come from the “New Programs/Facilities” fund, and would allow us to immediately save \$200 a month in electrical costs, and it would eliminate the need for \$600 of maintenance on lights that we have delayed.

One final note – several people have remembered that we redid some of our lighting about 15 years ago – so why again? Because in 15 years the technology has changed rapidly, and LEDs, not readily available then, are now around and are cost effective.

Fall Stewardship Ministry

Our Fall stewardship ministry has us really excited! After a process of consultation and discernment, the Congregation Council and our “Stewardship for All Seasons” team propose a bold ministry plan for 2020. We believe it is important in a changing world to create new ways to connect families and young people with Jesus, while maintaining the excellent ministries we currently have, ministries that impact all ages, in a variety of ways.



Our plan has three strategies:

1. ***Support our current ministries***, in order to maintain their excellence.
2. ***Introduce a new Wednesday evening worship***. Different from Saturday/Sunday, this worship would be especially designed for families and young people (but everyone is ALWAYS welcome!).
3. ***Expand our very part time youth ministry director position to full time***, allowing for more significant interaction and nurture of our many young people, and greater support for families.

As part of the emphasis you will be invited to join in this adventure as we seek to increase our gifts and offerings by \$60,000, which would allow us to engage in our three strategies.

In mid-October you will receive a mailing with your personal invitation to join us in “making disciples of all ages,” along with a “Statement of Intent” card. Then, on ***October 19/20 we invite you to return your intent during worship*** as we celebrate God’s blessings by responding generously to God’s call. Can’t be there? We’ll contact you so you too can participate in “making disciples of all ages.”

We look forward to our fall emphasis, and we ***thank you*** for all your support in our ministry together!

Forward: Fearless and Faithful!

We have been praying, talking, dwelling in the word, and engaging the public and our own members to determine how we as a church can continue to use the Word and our actions to promote hopeful and healthy ministry that is not afraid of differences and is able to adapt to the changes we see all around us.

This is a very slow process and again we do not know the outcome. Please keep us in your thoughts and prayers as we continue on this journey.





Coulee Region Hunger Walk/Run

Our area is about to engage in a huge community effort to fight hunger. The first Coulee Region Hunger Walk/Run is scheduled for **Sunday, October 13th**. Many community and church members have been involved in planning this event which replaces the CROP Walk in our area. The Coulee Region Hunger Walk/Run puts much emphasis on hunger in the Coulee area but can also include the **Care & Share Food Pantry and ELCA World Hunger**.

Participants in the Run/Walk are asked to make at least a \$20 donation. Pledge forms will be available in the church office. From the proceeds, WAFER and Hunger Task Force will each receive 35% of funds raised. ***The remaining 30% will go to any other non-profit food relief program of the walker's choice. Just write Care & Share Food Pantry or ELCA World Hunger in the space provided on the pledge envelope as the destination for your 30%.***

Our Savior's Mission in the World Sunday School Choirs

Music, music everywhere! Each week during the Sunday school hour, the children have a time for music. They split into two groups – 4K through 2nd grade and 3rd through 5th grade. For the past several years, Mike Larson led the older children and we thank him for that ministry. Beginning in 2018, Stephanie Subjek took over leading the group of younger ones, and in 2019 she will also be leading the older children. Ilene Pavelko and Linda Berg continue to accompany these choirs.



When the younger children sing in worship, it is the first Sunday of the month, while it varies with the older youth, but always at 10:30 AM.

- Received and approved the minutes from the August meeting. Received and reviewed the financial reports and pastoral reports for August.
- Heard that we were awaiting a proposal on LED lighting throughout the building.
- Received updates on Forward: Fearless and Faithful and Stewardship for All Seasons.
- Authorized the replacement of computers in the office at a cost not to exceed \$4000, with funds drawn from the Memorial Fund.
- Heard that with the election of a Bishop at the 2020 synod assembly, voting members to the assembly will need to be determined earlier this coming year than in the past.
- Adjourned to enjoy fellowship time with family members who had joined the gathering.
