# Two simple words ... Thank you

FROM THE PASTOR

It was stewardship Sunday, we celebrated the occasion with cake between services and upbeat music. As folks were invited to bring up their intent cards and place them in the baptismal font, we sang "We are marching in the light of God", but changing the words to "we are *giving* in the light of God." Pastor Jon then continued with his sermon, talking about how God is like an apple – there are many things one can do with an apple and there are many things that God does in our lives. As we sang "we are *basking* in the light of God", the children gave everyone in the congregation an apple. In the silence that followed the end of the song, one could hear a still, small voice say with clarity, confidence, and boldness - "THANK YOU!"

We may have smiled as we heard those words, but it should have also made us stop and think. Two simple words ... thank you... but words that were heartfelt, sincere, and unexpected in that moment. Perhaps it takes an innocent child to teach the rest of us.

How often do we stop and say thank you? How often do we take the time to acknowledge an act of kindness, a gift, words of comfort and care, the mere presence of another? How often do we thank God for all that he has gifted to us, not the least of which is our very life?

Thank you - There is power in those two simple words. Power to create relationship, power to let someone know how special they are, power to affirm an action, power to be faithful.

As I sat in worship these last week's listening to the various voices sharing their stewardship stories, I couldn't help but think of a time in my life – long ago when I was single, living

on my own, with all of the bills and commitments that come along with that – when I was asked to do a temple talk on my own stewardship. I really didn't feel qualified to do it, and talking in front of people really scared me. After praying and reflecting, God gave me the courage to say thank you.

I remember sharing how I would look in my wallet on a Sunday morning, find a couple of dollars that I thought I could spare, and put them in the offering plate. I figured that was good enough, I was doing my part. But the more involved I became in the life of my church, the more I saw what we were doing, the more I knew we could do more, the more I wanted to be a part of making those things happen. I also realized I wasn't stopping to say thank you to God for all that he had given me. I wasn't giving out of gratitude, I was just going through the motions. So, I decided to do things differently, I would increase my giving and I would write the check to church first - first fruits, if you will. It was a bold decision and it took courage to do it – it took faith. But in all the years that followed, I never lacked for anything, my bills always got paid, I wasn't deprived of doing things with my friends or traveling with my family, and it felt really good! And I was thankful.

Back to today ... Thank you to those who shared your stories, to those who listened to the stories and took to heart the words and emotions and challenges that were shared, and who acted boldly as you thought about your own stewardship, and your own relationship with God. Thank you to God for being here in this place, gifting us with life and people who create community and who do ministry.

## Our Savior's Mission in the World Handbell Choirs

Another in a series of ministries in which we are engaged as part of our faithful stewardship and discipleship.

Bell ringing is one of the oldest forms of musical art. It is widely believed that the earliest "bells" were large slabs of stone suspended by leather straps and struck with wooden clubs. We've come a long way since then!



Our handbell choirs meet weekly from September through May and play for services about every six weeks. We have a three-octave set of Malmark handbells and a two-octave set of Suzuki hand chimes.

One of the challenges a handbell choir faces is the fact that each note is assigned to a specific person. If that person is not there, no one plays that note, which influences the group as a whole. As you can imagine, the level of commitment required by a player is considerable.



Handbells certainly add another dimension to the music of the church. There are so many techniques to master, so many new things to try, so

much fun to be had. A group of individuals, working together to make music praising the Lord!

The next time you hear the bells, remember that this ministry happens because of you and your financial gifts. *Thank you for your support that allows us to make beautiful music – together!* 



# **Congregation Council Review**

The Congregation Council met on Monday, October 14, with President Ender calling the meeting to order. At this meeting the council:

- Engaged in discussion and prayer around the story of Jacob in Genesis 32:22-31.
- Approved the council minutes, and received financial reports and reports from the pastors, all for September. Also approved the minutes from the special congregational meeting.
- Discussed the LED lighting project in the building. Appointed Jeff Rich, Eric Iliff, and Carl Wallace to consider choices for fixtures.
- Heard an update on "Forward: Fearless and Faithful" and "Stewardship for All Seasons."
- Decided to have the pastors assemble a team to review the Child Safe Policy. Heard that the Audit Committee will need to begin work shortly, and that a sample Sexual Harassment Policy will be sent out prior to the November meeting for review.
- Received into membership Scott and Sandra Horstman (transfer from Coon Valley), and Brenda Skittone (reactivation). Also received Jim Tocko as an Associate Member.
- Directed Judy Gilbert to explore some options for refurbishing vacuum cleaners or purchasing new units.
- Heard that synod assembly voting members should be selected sooner this year due to the election of a new bishop. Noted that since the constitution calls for them to be selected by the congregation, they should be elected at the 2020 annual meeting.
- Directed the pastors to develop a process for lifting up candidates for elected offices that involves the entire congregation, and to engage in that process during November.

The council meets again on Monday, November 11. See one of the pastors or Lynette Ender if you have any questions.
