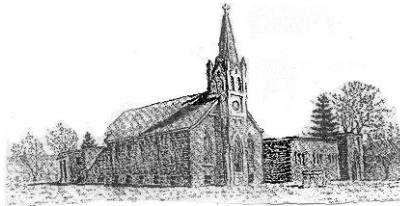

Put it in the books!

The annual meeting for 2020 is now history. Reports have been received, the budget approved, and we have thanked those who have shared in the leadership of this congregation.

That last part is important – Pastor Jean and I are very thankful for those who have been part of our council leadership, who are now moving on to new roles – Lynette Ender, Judy Gilbert, Fran Noffke, and Rich Clements. We are also thankful for the new leaders – Naoko Giblin, Carolyn Karl, Bonnie Gensch, Chad Vick, and Jaime Fortier. Good, faithful people, all of them. So, we thank you...and we thank God for you!

But annual meetings are more than just “past” history. We make history for the year to come. In adopting budgets and electing leaders, we look ahead, not behind. And frequently annual meetings approve future actions, like building programs, or renovations, or other large \$ adventures.

This year, however, is different. Our adopted budget reflects the mission priorities that the Congregation Council identified last year, priorities lifted up in our stewardship emphasis this past fall, and which your giving makes possible. These priorities are not about things. They are about real people in a real world.

So, what’s happening? For starters, our 2020 adopted budget will help us maintain the excellence of our ministry. Our staff is compensated appropriately, and we have restored the cuts made to mission support last year. That’s good news!

But the budget isn’t just about keeping things the same. We are looking at some new and expanded ministries, and that is the exciting part.

First, Wednesday evening worship! We don't know how this will work out, but the numbers are striking. In 2019 our weekend worship average dropped (like just about every other congregation) to 221/week. But Ash Wednesday rose to 287, and Advent worship on Wednesdays went from 80 to 110. Lent didn't rise, but didn't really drop either. Moreover, since we started talking about Wednesday worship lots of folk have asked when it's going to start. Clearly, people are interested.

So, what will it look like? I'm not sure – we will create a team to set the parameters, but I'm guessing a 30-40-minute informal worship, with a different style of music, perhaps one Bible reading, and some time for prayer. We will include Holy Communion on a regular basis, and each week a message from the pastors – or from someone else. Laid back and relaxed – and filled with lots of Jesus! I don't know how this will all end up, or how it will be received, but I'm ready to try and to see where God leads us.

But wait, there's more! Our budget also increases the resources for our Director of Youth Ministry. We will move that position to a very definite half time position. We've done that before, but this time with a more intentional effort to make sure the funding is there. We want to build a youth ministry program that is well rounded, encompassing mission trips, mission work, and regular opportunities for young people to learn and practice their discipleship. We want to connect with our kids, and with kids “out there.” And we want to be a support to their parents – to families that find the world moving faster and faster.

Now, to be honest both of these ventures are grounded in faith. We have the ability to make a two-year commitment both to the worship and to the position. After that? God knows...and we will find out. But our challenge will be to keep these ministries faithful and thriving.

At the same time, we will be willing to make changes. We aren't about creating the “perfect” ministry, and if it's not perfect, “pulling the plug.” We are bold – we can give it a try, and then

make the changes we need to make. Because we are confident that God is at work – in these ministries, and in us.

And that’s why this annual meeting is different. The world around us is changing, and it’s scary, even overwhelming. But we are not alone. Remember? God is at work. And so, we move “forward, fearless and faithful” to make a difference in a very hurting and broken world.

Keep watching for details as the year unfolds. And know that as you support the work we do together, you are really a part of something exciting – and life changing!

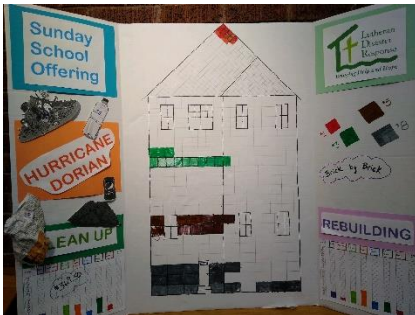

Sunday School News

It's hard to believe we are into the second half of the Sunday school year! Our children faithfully join us each week to learn about the life of Jesus through stories from our *Whirl* friends (when we don't have to share the TV screen with Pastor Jon! 😊), lessons with their teachers, and music.

Don't let the cold and snow keep you away ... you will always find a warm welcome here in this place! For those turning 4 years old during the year, we invite you to join the 4K class anytime. Remember to invite your friends, too!



Our ***Sunday School offerings*** this year are being collected for **Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR)**. In the aftermath of the devastation of Hurricane Dorian in August 2019, LDR is on site with people and resources to help with the

clean-up process and the rebuilding of lives. And we want to help, too! First comes the removal of the garbage and rubble left behind from the storm. Then the rebuilding. With the collection of \$369.50, the debris has been cleaned up. We are now adding the bricks to our house as we help to rebuild shelter for those who have become homeless.

Through late January we have collected \$275.75 for this effort. The 2nd grade class is leading the way with \$74.40, followed by the 1st grade with \$58.80 and the 4th grade with \$43.50. Check out our progress on the poster in the Gathering Area. *“Big people” can also contribute to this effort too – simply put “Sunday School – LDR” on an envelope and put it in the offering plate!*

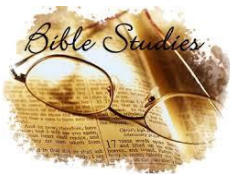

So, Did You Notice?

Our new lights are in, on, and up! The project to take our lighting to 100% LED is now almost complete. Around 500 tubes were replaced with LED, and several light fixtures added or replaced. Already the first electric bill shows significant savings, and we are confident that this project will pay for itself, not only in reduced electric bills and replacement costs, but also in the maintenance of ballasts. And of course, all of that is good for the environment too!

The project also added lighting to closet space and new fixtures to even out the lighting in the back of the sanctuary. The only portion of the project left to go are the outdoor lights by the Leonard St entrance. Those will need to wait until spring, with new fixtures installed.

Thanks for all who helped make this project happen, especially Jeff Rich. Good stewardship means better lighting, more efficient use of our financial resources, and care for the environment!



Congregation Council Review

The Congregation Council met on Monday, January 13, with President Lynette Ender calling the meeting to order. At this meeting the council:

- Completed a study and reflection on the role of the bishop, and the upcoming election for bishop in the La Crosse Area Synod. Directed Pastor Jean to submit responses to the synod survey.
- Received the pastor's reports and financial reports for December, and approved the minutes of the December council meeting.
- Heard that the lighting project is essentially complete, other than the lights outside the building along Leonard St, which will be completed in spring.
- Heard updates on both Forward: Fearless and Faithful, and Stewardship for All Seasons.
- Made minor revisions to the job description for the Administrative Assistant.
- Approved adjustments to 2019 salary and mission support as recommended by the Administration Committee.
- Recommended to the Annual Meeting the 2020 budget as proposed by the Administration Committee.
- Expressed thanks to outgoing council members, especially Lynette Ender for her year as president.

The council meets again on Monday, February 10. See one of the pastors if you have any questions.



Our Savior's Mission in the World Feed Our Children

Feed Our Children (FOC), summer lunch program, serves the children of West Salem by providing two meals a week throughout the summer months. FOC works through the generosity of others by both donations and volunteers.

Our Savior's is "home base" for Feed Our Children, providing kitchen space and storage space for all FOC inventory. While we have support from throughout the community, a great deal of volunteer hours, food donations, as well as dollars come from the members of Our Savior's.



No Child Should Be Hungry

During ten weeks each summer, members and non-members, young and old gather in the church basement to prepare full and healthy meals for over 200 children each week. Additional volunteers arrive later to transport and serve these meals. Serving takes place at three different sites in West Salem

in order to reach as many of the children as possible on both sides of the highway and both ends of town. Our partnership with the West Salem Boys and Girls Club also helps us reach children without having to single out anyone based on need. All children eat together and enjoy a common meal.

More than one person, inside and outside the congregation, has expressed how much this ministry means to our community. We make a difference and change lives!

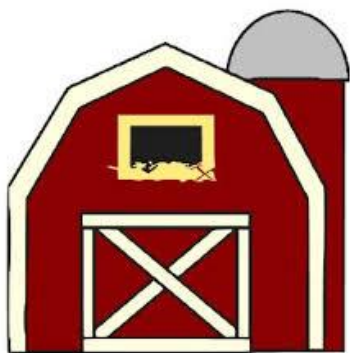
