Spoiler alert: Lent, confirmation, and Bay City, Michigan all have something linking them together...

FROM THE PASTOR

How so? Read on!

Let's start the newsletter from Messiah Lutheran Church in Bay City. The pastor, Andreas Teich, a classmate of mine, shared a blog entry from Brian Hehn, Director of The Center For Congregational Song of the Hymn Society of the United States and Canada. Originally posted December 18, 2019, these reflections seemed worthy to share with you.

After dismissing the idea that the church is dying, Hehn says this:

The church isn't held together by what we do or don't do. If that was the case, there wouldn't be a church today.

Seriously...have you read church history? It's terrible. Have you read the Old Testament? The people of Israel screw things up pretty consistently. If you think the church is doing things today that are unrivaled in their bad-ness...please read more history and more scripture. The church isn't held together by what we do or don't do; it's held together by the Spirit of God. Always moving, provoking, stirring in new and unexpected places: The Spirit is always at work in, around, and in spite of whatever evil we can throw at it. That is why the church still exists today.

If we're worried about the church "dying," that says more about our faith in God (or lack thereof) than in the long-term viability of the church. If you're more concerned about preserving the church than you are following God's call at any time, you've lost your way and you are part of the problem. Is God not loving enough to see the church into its next step? Is God not faithful enough to stick by us this time? I believe in a God who is more faithful, loving, and compassionate than I can possibly imagine...so I just don't have time or energy to worry about the church's longevity.

Brian goes on to say that many of his millennial friends are turned off by the church because it seems that too often church is about...church! Not God, not an excitement for the good news of Jesus, not the needs of people. The church is concerned with itself. They're not into that, and Brian says, "I don't blame them."

The future of the church (actually, the future of everything) is in God's hands. Got that? GOD'S...not ours. And that means that we are freed to focus on our calling, not ourselves. Indeed, our biggest problem is not that we don't do enough. Rather, we do too much of our own stuff, of our own creation, and our own "fixing," and not enough of God's stuff! And in the end, that's what matters, because it's still up to God!

Which brings me to Lent. Lent, which began February 26 and runs until Holy Week and Easter (April 5-12), is traditionally about three things:

- 1. We hear and reflect on the suffering and passion of Jesus.
- 2. We take a look in the mirror, reflect on our sinfulness and failings, and seek to live different lives.
- 3. Ponder anew what it means to be baptized, and to live as faithful disciples of Jesus.

Good stuff, all of it! And we should do all that.

But what if instead of focusing on us as persons we did the same for us as a congregation? What if we took stock of our work together, acknowledged our failings and shortcomings, and then remembered who we are - a community of the baptized - a gathering of disciples?

And then, what if we really got into God, the gospel of Jesus, and the needs of those around is – and let God handle our future?

That starts with discerning God's calling as we listen to God speak. Which leads me to part two. Want to try a different way to listen to God speak?

Take a walk. No, not on the wild side. Take a walk in the neighborhood, or maybe in the woods.

Sunday, March 29 join Adam Kennedy's confirmation small group as they take a stroll from church (at 9:30 AM) down to Lake Neshonoc, and back again. See our neighborhood with new eyes. Chat with others as they do the same. Listen to God speak in the sounds and silence around you. Then, return to be fed with God's gifts of grace so you can...go back out into the world around us!

Or...

Sunday, April 19, join the Forward: Fearless and Faithful team on another forest walk. Keep your eyes peeled as you look for God at work in the renewal of life and spring begins to "spring forth."

More details on both of these elsewhere in this newsletter. But either way, listen to God speak, and know that God is here...God is in charge...and God holds the future – yours and that of the church – in very good and secure hands!

Sunday School News

The year is flying by. We just said good-bye to the *alleluias* and buried them under the altar, not to be spoken again until Easter morning.

In the midst of a winter storm in early February, 9 children, 4 teachers, and a music leader braved the weather to be here to learn about Jesus and sing his praises! Wow!

Our **Sunday School offerings** this year are being collected for **Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR)**. In the aftermath of the devastation of Hurricane Dorian in August 2019, LDR is there to help with the clean-



up and rebuilding. And we want to help, too! We initially collected \$369.50 to help with the clean-up phase, and are now working to add bricks to our house as we help to rebuild shelter for those who have become homeless. Through late February we have collected \$349.36 for this effort. The 2nd grade class is leading the way with \$88, followed by the 1st grade with \$69.30 and the 4th grade with \$61.50.
