Pastor's Reflections

Light at the end of the tunnel!

Look carefully...there it is...light at the end of the tunnel! The word that two vaccines have shown remarkable effectiveness and appear to be safe, is great news. Finally, there is some hope.

But before we get too excited, as they say, “the devil is in the details.” And the detail is “April!” That’s when they think the vaccine will be available to the general public. Before then, the most vulnerable, and health care workers who take great risks, go first, and rightly so! We care in our society for the vulnerable, and we affirm the work of those who are willing to take risks to care for others. That’s the right thing to do.

But it does mean the tunnel is longer. And that means the darkness will not only last, but probably get deeper before it gets better.

Darkness. Other than the dreaded four-letter word (snow!), darkness defines the season. Yes, I know we have Christmas (I’ll come back to that), which gives us a momentary (and hopeful) diversion, but in the end it’s the darkness that remains. The darkness that deepens. The darkness that overwhelms us.

For some, with “seasonal affective disorder,” this is a really bad time of the year. But even if we aren’t struggling with “SAD,” the darkness still wears on us and drains us.

And this year, the darkness is even darker. Yes, the election is behind us and while the transition is proving challenging, it will happen. But Covid remains. And Covid is still Covid. Talk of vaccines may lighten our spirits a bit, but the pandemic is still strong, raging, and deadly. And it will be for months to come. The darkness isn’t going away anytime soon!

Of course, you know that. You've felt it, and so have I. The anxiety over routines that remain changed and then still changing.

Like, for example:

- We can't be with family during the holidays as we'd like.
- Kids remain virtual in school.
- The shopping season is all messed up (bad enough for shoppers, but what about store owners and employees?).
- Restaurants can't do the normal business, so what happens with Christmas and New Year's?
- NO Christmas Eve worship – no church, bustling with worshipers, singing the familiar carols with gusto.
- Health care facilities are filling up...elective procedures are on hold...and what of the people, health care workers? What's their stress level these days?
- And then...that little cough or bit of a sore throat. Is it, could it be, maybe me too? I don't even want to think about that!

The darkness...darker, deeper, bleaker...than before. The vaccine is on its way, but there's a lot of darkness before we get there. A lot of hurt, fear, uncertainty, anxiety, despair, and even death. The darkness is overwhelming and unrelenting.

But remember the season. And remember the promise.

A child was born long ago in a land far away. In a simple stable, surrounded by dirt, and cold, and yes, darkness. Yet, this child was, and is, more than a child. This child is Immanuel. This child is "God with us" (that's what the word "Immanuel" means!).

That's the season. We love the music, food, trimmings, decorations, and yes, the gifts, but that's not really it. The season is the child, the season is Jesus. Immanuel, "God with us." God here, in our world, in the cold and darkness, not abandoning us, but sharing our journey with us.

But then...what happens when "God is with us?" The season becomes the promise.

And what's the promise? Light! Light shines! And not just on bright, sunny days. Light shines in the darkness, and no matter what, the darkness cannot overcome the power of the light (John 1:1-5). Even in the midst of Covid.

There are going to be difficult days ahead. I wish I could promise that God will somehow miraculously, almost magically, return us to the normal life we so dearly miss, and do so with joy and wonder, avoiding the pain and fear. But the fear, the pain, the brokenness are real and powerful. Yet, the gift of faith (God's gift TO us through the Holy Spirit) clings to the promise. That promise, that in the fullness of time the darkness will be shed aside by the light of Jesus, even this year, even in a time of pandemic.

And so, as you do every year, hear again the Christmas story, and in the manger, as you gaze at the child, see before you the season. But as you hear the story and see the season, take a glance down the tunnel. The darkness is strong. But there is light.

And in the light, hear the promise, and know that the promise is stronger. We will get through this, not because we persevere, or dig deeply, or hang on tenaciously. We will get through this because the light is shining, and it is greater than the darkness.

That has always been the message of Christmas. This year the message rings out even louder!

In the meantime, remember the words of Martin Luther – to trust God, but also to do what we need to do not only for ourselves, but especially to protect our neighbors (*"Whether One May Flee From a Deadly Plague," Luther's Works 43:132 – for more on that, check out my article in the July, 2020 newsletter*). That means I wear my mask, I distance, I avoid unnecessary groups, and I work hard to honor and uphold others around me, knowing that we are all stressed and in need of care and understanding.

So, embrace the season, live in the promise, be faithful, and care for the “others” you encounter. The child – Immanuel – God is with us! And the darkness cannot overcome the light!

Stewardship for All Seasons Update

Thank you! We had a GREAT response to our “drive-up” Stewardship Sunday on November 15. Over 80 people joined us, safely in their cars. And what did we do?



- Shared a brief Holy Communion service...
- Received “Statement of Intent” cards...
- Distributed the remaining “Lakeview Giving Tree” tags (I knew we could get them all out!) and a number of pictorial directories...
- Sent everyone forth with a bag of lefse...
- Relished the opportunity to see some faces and engage in some brief conversation.

Others have mailed their Statement of Intent card back to the office. If you haven’t had a chance to do that, there’s still time. We appreciate all you share with us, and your Statement of Intent allows us to make appropriate and responsible plans for our ministry in 2021. Your response is important!

And a bit more...

The CARES Act adopted earlier this year includes two provisions for tax consideration...

- If you take the standard deduction in your Federal tax return, for 2020 only you can include a one-time deduction of \$300 to charitable giving.
- If you itemize, you normally cannot deduct more than 60% of your adjusted gross income. For 2020 only, there is no limit on your charitable contribution deduction.

Why these provisions? To encourage charitable giving during these difficult times. But, as always, consult a qualified tax advisor for all the details!

With the end of the year fast approaching, this is the time to make sure you are up to date on

In order to be included on your 2020 giving statement, gifts must be received in the church office **by noon on December 31, 2020.**

Thinking Ahead ... 2021 Annual Report deadlines

It's hard to imagine, but the new year is right around the corner. And that means getting an annual report together to share with the congregation all that has happened in 2020. We are looking for reflections from the various committees, teams, and ministries to be included in the report. Please note we will need those reports, preferably electronically, in the office as follows: **Written Reports by Wednesday, January 6** and **Financial Reports by Monday, January 11.**



Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, November 9, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in study and prayers.
- Approved the minutes of the October 12 Council Meeting, and received the October financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries.
- Heard that Pastor Jon has submitted the paperwork for the PPP Grant.
- Heard a preliminary report from the Tech Team. Asked that the team explore a second proposal/bid for the work.
- Received a report from the Administration Committee. Decided to remove the “interim” label and engage Wendy Kane as permanent Director of Youth Ministry.
- Discussed Nominations, noting that while we still have time, that time is running short.
- Received a video message from Bishop Arends thanking the council for its work to keep people safe.
- Watched videos and heard preliminary information about Safe Families for Children.
- Received Dolores Sinclair into membership from Mabel Lutheran Church, MN.
- Noted that this will be the first year without a “council and families” Christmas gathering. The December meeting will continue to be virtual.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, December 14th at 7 PM via Zoom. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior’s, contact Steve Ahles or one of the pastors.
