Pastor's Reflections

So, it's our turn. As I write this we are in quarantine. Some mild symptoms of Covid in our house, but two negative tests. So ... not sure, but we are playing it safe. Going nowhere, doing what we can from the house, and waiting it out.

It's been over a week, and "freedom" is days away. Looks like we will make it. But ... what if?

I wondered that a few times over the past week, and given that we are not "safe" yet, I still wonder ... what if?

While finding things to do, I've seen more stories of people whose lives have been devastated, and even ended, by this virus. What if that was us? Me? Or worse, my wife? Or even worse, my child?

So ... I'm wondering ... and pondering ...

There are always a lot of lessons to take away from a moment like this. Like, a reaffirmation of the importance of people in my life. I don't even want to think about what it would be ... what it would be to lose Pastor Jean or Rebecca ... and what has it been for others, to lose a loved one who is in an ICU bed, but unable to be visited, unable to be with loved ones as life is ebbing away. Too painful!

A take away? Treasure the gift of those in your life!

Another lesson ... we have been very careful, masks, distancing, haven't eaten out in 10 months (LOTS of take outs to bring home instead!), and not taking many chances. We still got (it appears) the virus. That doesn't mean, however, that our precautions weren't of value, and won't continue. In fact, all the more. Since we aren't feeling very ill, what if we hadn't determined we might have Covid and we went about the community living more recklessly? We might have shared it with you!

Not a good thing! But, a take away? Remember what Martin Luther said when confronted with a return of the “Black Death” in 1527 ...

I shall ask God mercifully to protect us. Then I shall fumigate, help purify the air, administer medicine and take it. I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order not to become contaminated and thus perchance inflict and pollute others and so cause their death as a result of my negligence. If God should wish to take me, he will surely find me, and I have done what he has expected of me and so I am not responsible for either my own death or the death of others.

In other words, even though we have (it appears) “dodged the bullet,” we still bear a responsibility to you – our neighbor. A reminder that in many ways our response to the virus is less about ourselves ... and more about you!

But there is one more lesson. And that’s about God and God’s work in the world. We’ve had conversations with a bunch of health care folk, including the school nurse, the “telephone” nurse, and even our doctor. Health care professionals. God’s agents of change. In them, God is at work.

Moreover, we are watching the horizon for the coming of the vaccine. Again, God at work – in scientists, health care professionals, and all the support personnel. God at work to bring change, to restore life, to rekindle hope.

Most of all, resting in God’s embrace, we learn (again) to trust in God’s care, even in these days that continue to test our faith and wear us down. Even now, in days where we find it difficult to see where our world is heading, we do see God at work!

And that is a good thing! The take away? Yes, right now, more than ever, we do need to see where God is at work in our world and in our lives. But that’s always true. Five years ago, and five years from now we will still live in a troubled, challenged world.

Covid wasn't around back then, and (we hope) it won't be around in coming years, but we still need to see God at work. The really good news is that back then, and in the years ahead, God will be with us, and God will be making life happen.

That lesson is the best take away, because I assure you – there will be pain, fear, uncertainty and brokenness in the years to come. But there will also be God's presence in the love of Jesus, and the power of the Holy Spirit. We won't be alone, we will be in God's embrace, and the crucified Jesus will still be renewing and restoring life.

And so as these days plod on, and it seems like this will never end (two weeks of quarantine seem long enough!), remember that the only thing that never (ever!) ends, is God's work through Jesus. Jesus, who in his death and resurrection transforms our lives and our world, renews and restores us to life. And Jesus, who sends the Holy Spirit to empower and re-energize our (sometimes) sagging faith.

The days are long, the end is in sight, but God is here, with us, right now!

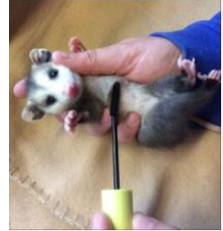

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, January 11, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in conversation and reflection around our baptisms and the importance of sponsors (godparents) in our lives.
- Approved the minutes of the December 14 Council Meeting, and received the December financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries.
- Heard that we are still awaiting another proposal on the tech project.
- Authorized an updated list of check signers.
- Received a report from the Administration Committee, including a proposal to adjust salaries. Noted that even with some increased salaries, the overall compensation portion of the budget will decrease by almost \$5000.
- Received advice from the synod regarding voting members to the 2021 Synod Assembly, noting that members elected in 2020 are still our voting members until a change is made. Will check with voting members to make sure they can still serve in that roll this year.
- Heard a letter from Bishop Jim Arends, now retired, which he requested be shared with members of the synod.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, February 8th at 7 PM via Zoom. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Steve Ahles or one of the pastors.
