Pastor's Reflections

April...to May...to June...the calendar moves on...and so does the pandemic. But finally, there seems to be real hope that we are close to the end. Yes, we are still worshiping differently, and elsewhere around the community restrictions are still in place. Still, there is – finally – light at the end of the tunnel!

That is, of course, good news. For all of us, in so many ways. All the disruptions of life over the past year are beginning to fade away. A return to normal is on the horizon.

But not everything will return to normal, and really, I hope not. Some things need to stay changed.

Like an appreciation for time with family, and the discovery of new ways to do old things, and learning to persevere, even in tough, uncertain times. We need to keep all that.

But what about church...and faithful disciples...and followers of Jesus...what about us? What do we need to keep?

We need to keep...the Church!

Of course, I want to keep the church, you know, Our Savior's. I'm looking forward to the day when this is really all over, and we can worship with a full house, gather together in Sunday School and Confirmation, and enjoy time together over cups of coffee. I'm hopeful we can again have a Norwegian Dinner, music from the choir, and the energy of children pulsating throughout the building. All that makes "church," church!

But that's not what I said. I want to keep "the Church." Church, with a capital "C."

Yes, I love Our Savior's, and I love the work we do together. We make a difference, we change lives, we proclaim hope in times of fear and uncertainty. We preach Christ crucified! The work of the church, the work we do as a community of the faithful.

The work of the "church." But what, then, is the work of the "Church" (capital "C")?

Well, a lot of it is the same. The "Church" isn't about Our Savior's, or the ELCA, or any other congregation. It's about the "Church" – the Body of Christ – God's people at work.



And a lot of that work happens together – you know, you, me, and everyone else, together, in the partnership of a faith community – like Our Savior's.

But when the "Church" is at work, it's about much more than what happens in the ebb and flow of congregational life. It's about what the Body of Christ is up to – here, there, and everywhere. It's about what we do every day, because in the end, the "Church" is present wherever you happen to be – right now. That is to say, the Church isn't confined to a building (like 359 N Leonard), but rather the Church is out and about, active and moving in our world, present wherever we happen to be, at any time, any place. And that is what the pandemic lifted up to us.

For a year the church building was closed, locked up. A few ministries went on (like the food pantry). Most, however, were on hiatus, shut down until...who knows?

But the ministry of the "Church" couldn't be confined by locked doors because the "Church" was already out and about, in the world, active and making a difference.

How so? In YOU – in your daily life, in the many ways in which you connected with those around you, making a difference in a world that was filled with so many unknowns, so many fears, and so many uncertainties. As YOU lived a life of faithful discipleship, in your corner of the world, wherever you happened to be, the “Church” was hard at work.

That has always been the case. We have always been the “Church” out in the world. But the pandemic gave us the opportunity to realize and discover that God is still at work through the “Church,” even when the “church” is restricted with locked buildings and curtailed programs.

So as our world begins to return to normal, I hope – even pray – that we don’t lose that discovery, that in our everyday lives, in our corners of the world, we are in fact the “Church” – hard at work, doing God’s work with our hands. Imagine what realizing that we are making a difference, each of us in our own way, as the “Church” might mean to us as we gather as the “church.” Each of us knowing that the other, like our self, goes out each day to be the “Church,” to be God’s presence in a disturbed and disrupted world.



That’s worth keeping! And perhaps one of the gifts of the pandemic that we can hang on to will be the opportunity to embrace this new discovery with joy, wonder, and amazement – as we see God’s Holy Spirit at work in what we do, and in the “new” that we have experienced!

So, as the pandemic begins to wane, look forward to coming back to church, to our worship, our gatherings, our ministries. But don’t lose the Church. Keep living as faithful disciples day in and day out, wherever you are. Keep being what Covid could not prevent – keep being...the Church!

Masks During “In-building” Worship

With the revised CDC guidance regarding masks and those who have been vaccinated, the question has been asked if we need to continue to wear masks during in-building worship. The answer, for the moment, is “Yes!” Here’s why:

1. The Congregation Council, in consultation with the re-opening team, has established that as our norm for worship. Until the council revises that, masks remain required.
2. More importantly ...the CDC guidance addresses those who are vaccinated. We have children in worship who cannot be vaccinated yet. Our Savior’s has a long history of being supportive and encouraging of children and families. It fits our mission to remain a safe place for children, especially when they are not yet able to be protected from Covid!

We understand the yearning to “ditch the masks,” and in time we pray that will happen. But for the sake of our children, just not yet!

In-Building Worship ...

In-building worship on Saturdays at 6 PM, Sundays at 10 AM, and Wednesdays at 5:30 PM. We will hear God's Word, sing quietly, and share in Holy Communion.

There are several things **you need to know** as you make plans to join us.

- **Sign up** on SignUpGenius using the link (<https://www.signupgenius.com/go/20F044CA5A629A7F85-worship>) or call the office (786-0030) and we will be happy to get you signed up.
- Attendance at each service will be **limited to 50** people. (When we worship at the Lion's Shelter in June, there will be no limit on numbers.)
- **Masks are REQUIRED** for those 2 years old and older. (If you forget your mask, we will have them available.)
- **Doors will be open 15 minutes** prior to the start of worship. We invite you to have your conversations outside.
- **Enter through the door off the alley/parking lot.** (If you need the elevator, please let us know that when you sign up and we will have someone greet you at the front door.)
- We will need an **usher/host team** in place or worship will be cancelled. (We will let you know in advance if worship is cancelled.) If you would like to be a part of the usher/host team speak to Pastor Jean.
- **Windows** must remain **open** so dress accordingly.

Office Hours

Beginning June 1, the church office and building will be open Monday-Friday,



8:30AM-2 PM. Use the East Avenue entrance. Please **wear your mask** upon entering the building.

Remember that we now have a locked and secure mail box outside the East Avenue entrance if you need to drop off an envelope or other similar material.

- Elections for Congregation Council and the Mission Endowment Fund Committee.
- Adoption of the 2021 budget.
- A proposal from the Congregation Council to make major video and audio upgrades in the sanctuary at a cost not to exceed \$40,000.

The annual meeting had been delayed due to the pandemic, but we are eager to gather together and consider our ministry and where God is leading us. We want you to be with us, and to share your voice as we together celebrate God's blessings even in the midst of a challenging time!

2020 Annual Report



The 2020 Annual Report is now ready!

The report provides a review of the ministries we carried out in the past year, even as we worked through a difficult year. The report also includes a variety of financial reports from 2020. It also includes the blueprint for our 2021 ministries in the form of the 2021 proposed budget.

Highlights of the Technology/Audio Project



The Congregation Council is preparing a proposal for the congregation to consider at the Annual Meeting – to significantly upgrade the technology in the sanctuary!

What's included on the project?

- Adding the ability to project words, music, and images on a screen in the front, along with a smaller screen for the area under the balcony.
- Installing the equipment to livestream our worship, then post the recording online, and create quality DVDs for our shut-ins. The equipment would allow for several camera angles along with zooming in for closeups. The camera would produce an HD quality picture.
- A major overhaul of the audio system, which hasn't had a significant upgrade in over 30 years!

The cost? Around \$40,000. The good news? Thanks to the Endowment Fund and a very generous donor, we already have \$14,000! More details in the June newsletter and at the annual meeting.

Adult Bible Study



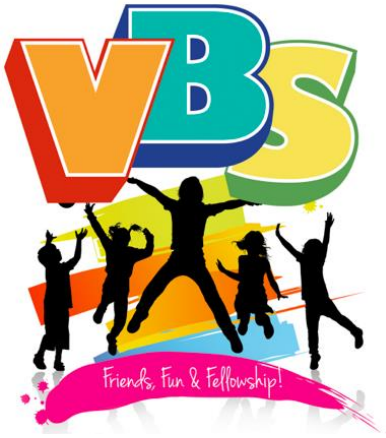
Bible study, via Zoom (or dial in as a conference call) continues on

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, May 10, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in conversation about how God has blessed us even during a pandemic.
- Approved the minutes of the April Council Meeting, and received the April financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries.
- Discussed how the resumption of in-building worship has proceeded. Determined that masks remain, but that the pastors may remove the masks while leading worship.
- Discussed opening the building and establishing public office hours. Directed the staff to proceed.
- Decided that defined groups, when all are vaccinated, may meet without masks provided no children are expected in the building for 24 hours.
- Decided to end the lease on Johnson South and open the building to a new tenant.
- Heard that we remain short on nominees for Congregation Council, and decided to continue to seek names.
- Reviewed the proposed budget and voted to recommend the budget to the congregation.
- Decided not to meet in June unless there is a need.
- Expressed thanks to Steve Ahles and Tracey Beckley for remaining on the council past the six-year mark in order to serve through the June annual meeting.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, July 12th, at 7 PM via Zoom. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact one of the pastors.
