Pastor's Reflections

Giving Thanks ...

It's that time of year again when we are supposed to stop and think about all that we are thankful for. At first thought that isn't as easy as it used to be. It's been a long twenty months. I don't know about you, but I'm weary, at times overwhelmed, the creative juices are no longer flowing, rather, they're just trickling. As I look around at things that need to be done, things that aren't getting done, and I get discouraged and frustrated. I look back on all that I think I've been missing, all that used to be "normal" and taken for granted, and I grieve and maybe even get a bit angry.

It's really hard to think about being thankful. What could I possibly be thankful for?

Maybe before I start throwing myself a pity party, perhaps I should take another look around, take a good look around. Maybe I should listen to what I preached recently and not just spew out empty words. There was a passage in Mark that talked about Jesus healing a blind man, and we talked about how we don't have to be physically unable to see, in order to be blind. We can be blind with 20/20 vision. To ensure the safety of all our worshippers, especially children, masks are required. For our kids' sake we can wear a piece of fabric!




7th **and 8**th **graders** also meet on Wednesdays at 6 PM as they explore "servant leadership."

Mission Endowment Fund Distribution

The Mission Endowment Fund will soon make its annual distribution, and it's looking for your help! We are seeking suggestions on ministries and community programs to support. Each year the fund shares approximately 4% of its value. We anticipate this year to disburse around \$16,000.

Recipients of support from the fund should be in one of three categories. You can get guidelines for suggested recipients from the office. The deadline for suggestions is Monday, November 8.

The Mission Endowment Fund began in 2004, and since then has distributed over \$200,000 to ministries here in West Salem and across the globe. The Fund receives designated gifts, and 70% of undesignated bequests. We are grateful for the generosity of those who years ago remembered Our Savior's and our ministry in their estate planning. They continue, even years later, to make a difference in the lives of people!



Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, October 11, with President Jen Linse presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in conversation and discussion about young people and their needs. Ended the time with prayer.
- Approved the minutes of the September 13 Council Meeting, and received the September financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries.
- Heard an update on the tech project and the landscape project.
- Authorized the purchase of new communion ware.
- Authorized using the Synod School of Theology as continuing education for Wendy Amundson, with the congregation covering half her class time, and providing for the cost of classes and books.
