## Pastor's Reflections

Summer is here and life (we hope) is (finally) back to normal! That really seems to be the big wish. Can't we just move beyond Covid back to where we were?

Looking around, however, it's apparent we aren't quite there yet. Masks are still present, mitigation steps are still in place in certain spots, and even though as I write this La Crosse County has slipped back to "low" community risk, just a week ago it was "high."

At Our Savior's too we are struggling to find our way back to normal, and that has caused some anxiety. The most obvious example is in worship. We aren't back up to the numbers we'd like. Things are still not back to normal.

That really shouldn't be a surprise. I've been reading a book by a Baptist church consultant. He says several things:

1. The old normal is NOT coming back. At all.
2. The new normal is not yet fully apparent.
3. Worship in the future will be smaller.
4. Digital (such as online) ministry, especially worship, will continue to grow, and will be a mission of its own.

Wow – not what I wanted to read, but as I see things, I think he's on target. And so, what's one to do? Cling to God's promise! **"I make all things new!"** (Revelation 21:5) But what "newness" of any value can we discover here?

Maybe more than we think. Let's consider our numbers. Numbers do not tell the whole story, and we want to make sure we don't get distracted or even buried by them, but numbers do help us understand what is happening around us. So, let's compare where we are, with where we were in 2019 using some numbers.

But first, some observations:

1. The Bishops of the ELCA have been told to expect worship attendance to drop 20-30% coming out of the pandemic. Fits with the book I read!
2. The ELCA suggests that online worship views, like our YouTube worship, should be counted for one week.
3. Since we cannot know how many people are watching on each “view,” use the industry standard of 1.9 persons per view.

So, what are we finding? Worship is indeed smaller than we once had, at least in the building. And that’s what we see, and what perhaps raises a bit of anxiety. Where once we had 100+, now we are excited when we top 50.

I don’t have exact worship counts for every weekend from 2019 (we don’t normally keep the individual weekend numbers from years past), but we can make some good estimates.

In 2019 our average for the year was 221. I figure a summer average of 140, and a normal, mid-year weekend, about 235. So, let’s take a small sample – the four weekends in February, and the first two weekends of June – a mix of mid-year and summer.

In 2019 we would have had four weekends in February at 235 each for a total of 940, plus (and this number I do have for certain) 28 total online views for an additional 53 viewers, giving a total of 993 for the month.



For the two weekends in June, using an average of 140 for 280 worshipers, along with an additional 10 online views, or 19 online, gives us 299 for two weekends in June.

Now, what about 2022? For February, our in-building worship attendance for four weeks totaled 323, and our online consisted of 226 online views, or an estimated 429 individuals. For two weekends in June, after removing lots of visitors for two baptisms, in-building worship totaled 156, while online we had 85 views estimated at 162 persons.

But wait, there's more! For years we have distributed a DVD to be used at Mulder's, but during the pandemic we began to distribute DVDs to individuals and to Salem Terrace. Each week an additional 16 persons watch worship on the DVDs.

Adding it all up...February gave us 816 worshipers, and two weekends in June engaged 350.

The numbers don't lie.

It is true. We have fewer worshipers in the building. But we also engage close to the same number of worshipers overall. In February we engaged 44 fewer per week, but in the first two weeks of June, we have engaged 25 more per week. And remember, things are safer now than in February, leading to an increase in the in-building part of our worshipping attendance.

Look, I get it. We would all like a packed house, but right now, and for the foreseeable future, and maybe into the new normal, that's not happening. But people are connecting, even when we can't see them. For some it's still safety, others are unable to be here due to mobility issues, still others are new folk, reached by our ministry even if it's obvious to us.

And that is what really matters. This isn't just about trying to get people in the building (remember my book – digital is a mission of its own?). Nor is it about making ourselves feel better in challenging times. Instead, it's about what we are

called to do – the mission God has placed in our midst. And we are doing it. We are connecting, just not the way we used to, and we are connecting even with folk we never encountered before (I won't go in to details here, but I can share some stories with you.)

Meanwhile, even as I write this, the Summer Lunch crew is hard at work, pastoral care is happening, and kids, supported by this congregation, are learning about Jesus at Sugar Creek. The bottom line – our ministry is working, and even thriving. Even when it doesn't look like it!

I do expect these numbers to change. September may give us an opportunity for something of a “reset,” but for now I am just thankful – **and I am excited** – that people are connecting and engaging with the good news of Jesus in a variety of ways, and in ways what we hadn't in the past.

And I am excited that even in a very changed world, God is working through us to make a difference, to proclaim the good news, and to bring life and hope to people.

So, there you have it – promise made and promise kept...  
***I make all things new!***

Yikes! It's July already! Summer is flying by...(how sad is that?) With that in mind, please continue to ponder (and discern) where God is calling YOU!

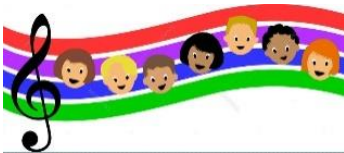
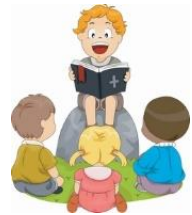
And how MIGHT God be calling you? Glad you asked!

Prayer Labyrinth

What is a “prayer labyrinth?” A labyrinth is a path that leads from the outside to the center. Not a maze designed to confuse, a labyrinth is instead a way to symbolically leave behind the hustle and bustle of the world, and enter a place of peace and quiet, where one can engage God in prayer and meditation. There’s even a bench at the center for a time of reflection.

We invite you to use the labyrinth, and let your friends know that it’s there. To follow the labyrinth, find the grassy path between the bricks along the side closest to the side walk...and then follow around and along until you come to the center. And when you are done, follow the path back as you reenter a busy and sometimes very hectic world.

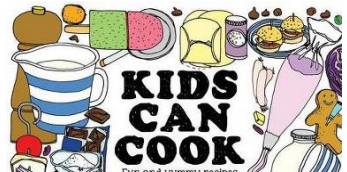
