Pastor's Reflections

I am a numbers person. I watch numbers for lots of things, and while sometimes it becomes a bit of an obsession (just ask my wife about that!), it's usually a helpful way to get a handle on where life is at these days.

Last month I gave you a taste of that as I considered what it means that God is always "making things new," even in our worship experience. That reality continues. As I write this (mid-July), this week has been a good example. Last Sunday we had 95 in worship. But we had another 14 watching DVDs we distributed, and as of this moment (Saturday morning) the YouTube worship has 44 views – the experts say about 80 viewers. So, as I write this, we have almost 200 from last weekend – and that is great!

But...the pews were still a bit empty, and we are still wondering where the pandemic is taking us. Moreover, as Lynette Ender shared in her recent sermon (great job, Lynette!), a lot of our "Martha type" ministries are on hold, or even "are no more." So...what does this all mean?

At our recent Synod assembly, we watched a video. The Synod had requested each congregation send a picture of a ministry, with a one sentence description. I sent in a picture of our summer lunch ministry. As the video played, I saw lots of ministry around our synod – really good ones. Some were food ministries, some were about clothing. Others involved service – cleaning projects, caring for those in need, and reaching out to parents and children. I watched them all because they were engaging and inspiring – and because ours was the last one! The point of the video was to remind us that even in disrupted, challenging times, we are still doing "God's work with our hands."

That got me thinking.
What if we did the same



thing here? At Our Savior's? What would our video look like?

Well, of course, we'd start with summer lunch. Did you know...other than the three weeks where the school has a grant to provide lunches to all the kids in summer school...we have been providing almost 400 meals a week? And even better than that, its not just been us alone...we have brought together people from other churches, from businesses, and from organizations...brought together to do mission...to do God's work? Sure, it sounds nice to say we did it all, but we did better – we provided an opportunity for the community to come together. That is awesome...and that is God's work!

By the way, I don't know who all is a part of summer lunch...I know Angie Hemker and Connie Pinski, but I also know there are even more involved. You know who you are, and so does God...so, thank you!

But what else would be in our video? Maybe...

- Food Pantry – more food, more community, more of “God’s work.” Lots of folk in this congregation and from the community. And again, God knows who you are!
- The quilting ladies – still working hard, even in the summer months. A group that gathers on Wednesdays, but also hands at work at home. Maybe that’s why they are setting new records. I remember when 200 quilts were a big deal. Now we’re shooting for 300. 300 people around the world, gifted with warmth and color. God’s work...
- Musicians of all kinds enhancing the various ways we worship – in person, DVD, YouTube, and even our worship once a month at Lakeview, Salem Terrace, and Mulder’s. God’s work, your hands, your fingers, and your voices!



- People soon to bring in supplies for school kits. I don't know who will do that, I just know we will see the pile begin to grow. God's work...even in crayons and erasers!
- Prayer shawls makers. They used to meet together, but while that is not happening, the prayer shawls keep arriving. A shawl to wrap someone in need, reminding them they are wrapped both in prayer and in God's embrace. Again...God's work...
- Teachers and others who love kids beginning to think about the fall and sharing faith with kids and teens. God's work through their time, energy, and talent – and hands too!
- The financial giving that provides resources to fight hunger around the world, and meet the needs in Ukraine. People putting their money where their mouth is, not just saying a good line, but giving for the sake of “God's work.”



- Kids off to Sugar Creek...learning about a God of love, and the call to be disciples of Jesus...and doing that with significantly greater financial assistance from Our Savior's, as we partner with Sugar Creek to do God's work.

That's a list...but wait! There's more!

Like all the stuff we do outside of church. Like all those who are in health care, sharing gifts of healing and wholeness. Or teachers and others in education, getting ready for another year of nurturing young lives. Or retail workers (like grocery stores) ... service providers (like restaurants and auto mechanics and more) ... and volunteers of all sorts...all of them, in a variety of ways, serving others, and all in subtle ways, doing God's work with their hands. We've got a lot of them in this congregation!

And then...my favorite recent example...the individual (you know who you are) who visited several of our residents at Onalaska Care Center (my mother was one of them) ...bringing flowers and a treat from Linda's. Nice, very nice. Then I visited someone in

another nursing facility, this time in La Crosse. They had been there too! A treat from Linda's to brighten a day. God's work...yet again!

Hey, that would be quite the video, don't you think? Let's see...I started with summer lunch...went through quilts, erasers, music, prayer, kids and teens, dollars and cents, health, wholeness, groceries, car repairs, and ended with Linda's. And all of it... God's work!

So, no more numbers to share, and maybe the numbers we see aren't what we'd like to see quite yet, but the video would be full and rich. And it would remind us of two things:

1. God is at work in our lives. No doubt about that!
2. God's work is happening with our hands. No doubt about that, either!

So, I'll tell you what I am trying to tell myself. Don't worry about the numbers. Just be faithful, and be what we have been gathered to be – BE the church, wherever you are.

That's how God's work happens – with our hands!

- 1 – box 24 crayons
- 1 – 2-1/2-inch eraser
- 4 – 70 sheet notebooks (no loose-leaf paper)
- 5 – blue or black ball point pens (no gel ink)

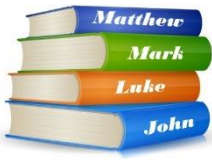
Chancel Choir
