Pastor's Reflections

A WORD

"A Gift?" ...

The Congregation Council has a Christmas gift for you ... *Guiding Principles!* Seriously? What kind of gift is that? I can't touch it or eat it ... I can't wear it or watch it ... it has no glitz or glamor ... it has no monetary value ... no one is fighting to get it ... So, just exactly what is a guiding principle, and why would I want it?

For much of the past year the Ministry Exploration Team met faithfully to talk about the life of the congregation ... what do we do well, what have we done in the past, where do we want to go in the future, what are we known for in the community, what do we want to be known for, what are we excited about ... After all of their thoughtful conversations, they came up with a list of observations and discoveries; a list of principles they believe define who and what we are as a congregation and as people of God.

That list was shared with the Council and further refined to come up with statements that can guide us as we go forward. Statements that we can use to help us make good decisions, in light of who we believe we are as a congregation and what our purpose is. These statements become our "guiding principles".

As we head into the new year, the full list of guiding principles will be shared with the congregation, and as various committees and groups meet, these guiding principles will be lifted up as our barometer when making decisions.

But for now, let's lift up the first guiding principle ... Jesus is Lord and Savior! What more needs to be said!? Jesus is

our Lord and Savior ... period, end of story! And what a better time than now to think about that. It's Advent and we are preparing for Christmas.

But how are we preparing? Baking cookies, decorating the house, putting lights outside and trying to outdo the neighbors, trimming the tree, writing the letters and signing the cards, buying the presents to put under the tree, listening to Christmas music ...

And maybe that's the problem, maybe that's why this gift doesn't seem all that, you know ... exciting. We get stuck in the glitz and glamor, the lights and decorations, the gifts we can get our hands on. Maybe we need to take a step back and think about that guiding principle ... Jesus is Lord and Savior ... to think about what this season is really all about and to focus our actions and decisions on that.



And to ponder the point ... Jesus is Lord and Savior. So, what IS the point? We begin our "Guiding Principles," we get ready to begin a new year, and really, we begin each day grounded in one fact – Jesus is Lord and Savior. And that fact makes all the difference.

To proclaim that Jesus is Lord and Savior is to proclaim the very core of faith, and the very core of faithful living. Especially at this time of the year there are a lot of distractions and diversions. Lots of things make a claim on us, demanding our attention. After all, lots to do!

But those claims don't end with the season. Day in and day out lots of things grab our attention. Lots of things that seem, at the moment, to be important, even critical. But in the end, in a world of brokenness and pain, a world full of hurt and hurting, a world that is so often shallow and disappointing, there is one thing that endures: Jesus is Lord ... and Jesus, the Lord, is our Savior.

And so, as we move forward as a congregation, and as disciples of Jesus, as we wonder and ponder where the world is headed, and where we are going, we continue to cling to the assertion that ... Jesus is Lord and Savior.

And that assertion, grounding us in God's presence, but also empowering us with God's gifts, sends us forward into the world with hope, confidence, and conviction that God really is at work in our world – and that we can be a part of all that God is doing.

And that's what these days of Advent lead us to ... to Christmas ... to the birth ... of Jesus, our Lord and Savior.

That's why this is a "Guiding Principle" – it defines and declares what we are, what is essential in our identity, and what's in our

"DNA." Quite simply put, you can't be what we claim to be without "Jesus is Lord and Savior," right at the top!

So, bask in that Guiding Principle, and watch next month for "Principle #2!"




Christmas Cantata





The Congregation Council met on Monday, November 14, with President Jen Linse presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in devotions and prayer around special people and exciting ministries.
- Discussed the ongoing "Vital Congregations" training.
- Adopted the revised guiding principles, and heard of plans to share the principles with the congregation.
- Heard that the Administration Committee would be meeting with Rachel Holthaus to discuss the youth ministry position on November 15, and that they would collaborate on revising the job description to match the vision of youth ministry around "Servant Leadership."
- Approved the minutes of the October 10 council meeting, and received the October financial reports.
- Heard that the contract for the tech project has been signed, and the initial payment of 50% has been made, with a January-February projected installation.
- Set the annual meeting for January 29, and discussed nominations and the budget work prior to the meeting.
- Discussed some December programming, including a "Christmas party" hymn sing on December 14.
- Received Lisa Cash as a new member, from Gift of Grace in Holmen.
- Was reminded that the December meeting will be at Pastor Jon and Pastor Jean's home.
