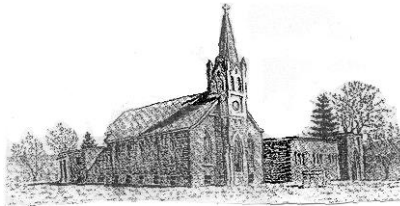

## Pastor's Reflections

### New Years!

Time to pull out a new calendar, get used to writing “23,” and make a bunch of resolutions that might make it to mid-January! It’s also time to pay the bills for Christmas, try to start losing the extra weight we gained, and fully embrace complaining about the cold and the snow. It is that time of the year!

But more seriously, New Year’s really is a chance to reflect and “redirect” ourselves. True, resolutions can fail, and there are a lot of less than desirable changes (like paying the bills) that are a part of the change in the calendar. But other changes are important ... essential ... and maybe even exciting.

Take, for example, the new “guiding principles” that Pastor Jean introduced last month. Hey, if “Jesus is Lord and Savior” (Guiding Principle #1) doesn’t excite you, what will? After all, isn’t that pretty central to who we are?

And that’s the point. A guiding principle is something we think is essential to who we are as a congregation, as God’s people. It’s sort of part of our DNA. And “Jesus is Lord and Savior” fits that. Can’t be “Our Savior’s” if we don’t claim, proclaim, and live out “Jesus is Lord and Savior.”

So maybe a good thing for us, as we move into a new year, is to continue to think a bit about who we are, and what makes us who we are. Which brings us back to our list of “guiding principles.”

1. Jesus is Lord and Savior.

Ok, we dealt with that. Pretty much the absolute core of who we are. I mean, if we don't buy that, we might as well shut down, right?

Now, moving right along ...

2. We welcome everyone, and we mean it.

Well, yes, of course we do. Doesn't pretty much every church proclaim that "all are welcome?"

True enough, and so do we. We welcome all to join with us in worship, in our community, in our service to the people around us. Doesn't matter who you are – we welcome you!

Talk is

But we also know that talk is cheap. Remember? Lots of folk say what we say. We welcome everyone ... except when it really matters. Are we really welcoming ... of anyone and everyone? Folk who look, speak, and think differently? Or just plain new folk?

I really do think we are fairly good at the welcome. We have new people in our midst, and while we don't have too many folks who look or speak differently, we also don't have too many in the community around us. We reflect West Salem and Bangor.

Still, communities change, and would we be ready to welcome those who are different?

But let's not get ahead of ourselves. West Salem and Bangor are what they are right now. And we welcome everyone. We follow our guiding principle.

Part 1, at least. But what about part 2?

We welcome everyone, and we mean it. *And we mean it!*



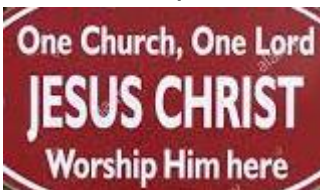
That's the key. Intentionality. Every congregation wants to think that it welcomes everyone. So, do we. But do we really mean it, or is it just talk? Or in other words, are we intentional about our welcome and do we do what we need to do to make it happen. Not just someday when someone who challenges us by their differences, but right now, when anyone enters our corner of the world.

Do we really mean it? Our “guiding principle” says we do. We welcome anyone and everyone, and we do what we need to do to show we are serious. You are welcome in our midst!

And why? Because “Jesus is Lord and Savior.” Jesus saves me ... and you ... and the newcomer, no matter who they are. And if Jesus is our Lord, we embrace all for whom Jesus died – everyone! Those who are just like me, and those who are very different. Everyone!

So, think for a moment ... imagine a year from now, beginning a new year (2024). How will we have changed as a congregation? What “everyone” will we have encountered, and who will have joined us? Picture that for a moment.

And then ponder something else ... how as the year unfolds can we be intentional, living out “Jesus is our Lord and Savior” in our welcome ... and showing that we mean it?

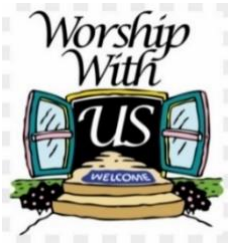

# **Hungry Jar Offering for January – Our Savior’s LaCrosse Women’s Clothes Closet**



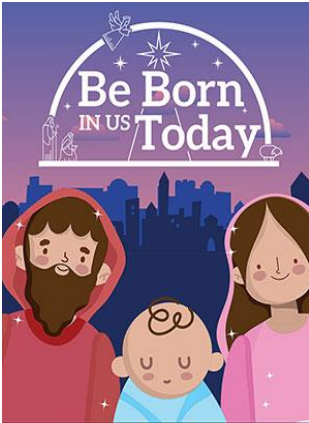
The mission of the Women’s Clothes Closet of Our Savior’s LaCrosse is to provide gently used clothing

to women who are entering the workforce, in the workforce, or otherwise in need. Started in 1997, the Women’s Clothes Closet was created as a project by a student social worker at the University of Wisconsin – La Crosse. In 2019, the Women’s Clothes Closet had 1,622 clients and received 968 donations that included clothing, shoes, new undergarments, jewelry, accessories, coats, make-up, and personal care items. New visitors to the Women’s Clothes Closet can choose three complete outfits. Returning visitors can select one outfit per visit, up to two times per month. No questions are asked about income or employment status.

At this time, they are especially in need of undergarments in very specific sizes. Unlike most clothes, undergarments must be new (still in the package) and not gently used. The folks at Our Savior’s are good stewards of the resources they receive to purchase the necessary items to keep their clients appropriately clothed.

The Hungry Jar for January is to provide resources to purchase the undergarments, but if you have items you wish to donate, the Women’s Clothes Closet needs gently used in-season clothing that is fashionable, clean, and in good repair. Bras (new), shoes, boots, handbags, scarves, and jewelry are also very much appreciated. Donations are made by appointment. Please call 608-784-5745 to schedule your donation appointment (please leave a message and someone will call you back to schedule).

- Took formal action to appoint Rachel Holthaus as permanent Youth Director. Decided to continue the current job description, but to revise the document within three months, after reviewing how the ministry is developing.

- Heard that the Mission Endowment Fund has completed recommendations for consideration at the annual meeting.

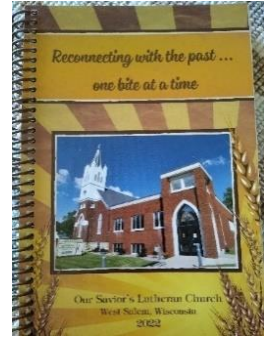
