Pastor's Reflections Farming and Lent ...

I am not a farmer. And Lent has just begun. Those two facts are intertwined. Believe it or not ...

From the tomato seeds I planted as a child that simply didn't, to failed Zucchini in Michigan, to, quite frankly, pretty lame peppers in West Salem, I just can't farm. True, the rhubarb has sprouted each year, and the raspberries have "berried," but let's face it – those are both pretty low maintenance. With the rest? Just give it a rest – it's not happening!

The truth is hard to take, but undeniable. A farmer I am not! And yet, I need the land. Desperately. I also need the real farmers, the ones who can nurture and coax the land to produce the sustenance that I,

and all of creation, depend on. So, for all of you who are, or once were, farmers, thank you! You have pretty much saved my life.

Well, maybe ... but let's not forget ... God had something to do with this too. In fact, we probably ought to give God the credit for life, and farmers the credit for faithful discipleship of the land. God's really the grower, with an assist from the farmers. We might say, "God's work, the farmer's dirty hands!"

But back to the land. The land that produces as God causes it to produce is, of course, a gift of a gracious God. It is God who brought into being the land so that it might be the cradle of life for all beings. The land, creation, the natural world around us. All part of God's plan for life.

That God would bring forth creation for the sake of life is on the one hand a remarkable gift of grace, and on another a bit of a "duh" moment. After all, isn't that what we read in the creation story in Genesis? God created ... and it was good! And then ... God gave humanity the responsibility to tend the gift of creation?

So, what's this all mean? At least three things:

- Creation, the wonder and beauty around us, is a gift to be treasured and cherished. Forests to mountains to rivers and lakes to wetlands to wildlife to crops and cattle ... all gifts!
- But more than that, the gift of creation is also the gift of nourishing and sustaining life – our life, and the life of all around us – people (all of them) and all forms of life.
- 3. But yet even more than that, creation is not just a sideline in our existence, or window dressing to be admired. Creation is God's mechanism to support and nurture life. That means that creation is more than God's doing, creation is God at work, and not just an "option" for us. When God gave humanity the responsibility to care for creation, God meant it!

That's why the Congregation Council believes that respect for and care of creation is one of our guiding principles as a congregation. We do not just care for creation because it is the "box in which we live," we care for creation because it is (at God's plan and direction) the source of our life. And the life of all around us!



So ... on the heels of our first three guiding principles ...

1. Jesus is Lord and Savior.

- 2. All are welcome, and we are intentional about that welcome.
- 3. God gifts and calls every one of every age to be a difference maker in the world.

we add number four ...

4. We treasure the gift of creation and embrace the call to protect God's world.



Part of faithful living is to know who and what we are, and what our limitations are. We are human, and we are limited – we are dependent on God's gifts for life – especially God's gift of creation!

But faithful living is also about responding to God's call to protect and care for the world around us.

And that's where Lent comes in. Lent is a time of introspection ... and repentance. We pause to take a careful and honest look at ourselves and how we relate to both God and the world around us, including creation. And then,



repentant, we change our direction, we change how we live. We don't just talk the talk, we walk the walk. We become intentional so that we may live out faithfully our faithful discipleship.

What that means for us is that faithfully living out our fourth guiding principle is to be repentant and to seek to live in a way that respects and protects the precious gift of creation. And Lent is a great time to renew our commitment as a congregation and as individuals to treasure, both in word and deed, the world around us. From farm fields to forests,


to rejoice in God's gifts and to work to protect for ourselves and for future generations not what God has given us, but what God has entrusted to us.

And perhaps there lies the key. The world does not belong to us, it is entrusted to us. In an incredible act of divine trust, God has trusted us with creation, it's care and it's preservation, that creation may sustain us, all of life, and the future yet to be.

Imagine that ... God trusting ... US? That is grace at work – God willing to trust us and welcome us as partners in the care of the world around us. Trusting us, because in the end, it's really God at work in us, in the grace of Jesus, and the power of the Holy Spirit.

Even if my tomatoes and peppers just don't cut it!

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, January 9, with President Jen Linse presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Welcomed back Bonnie Gensch, Chad Vick, Jaime Fortier, and Carolyn Karl, all re-elected to another term.
- Approved the minutes of the January Council Meeting, and received the January financial report.
- Heard a report from the pastors on ministries over the past month, and a report on activities across the synod.
 Affirmed the pastor's vacation schedule for March and June/July.
- Decided to move the March meeting to March 20, due to the pastor's weekend away in March.
- Noted several ministry teams needing some redevelopment including stewardship and youth ministry.
 Also discussed future fellowship activities and some new ministry possibilities connecting with community needs.
- Appointed Eric Ender and Bonnie Gensch as two additional voting members to Synod Assembly.
- Appointed Sharon Olson (2024) to replace Jeff Haldeman on the Audit Committee, and re-appointed Jim Anderson for a new three-year term on the committee.
- Elected Congregational officers ... President Jeff Haldeman; Vice-President – Brenda Skittone; Secretary – Alison Hemker; Treasurer – Jill Iliff.
- Discussed several property issues including the East Avenue entrance and the organ. Decided to develop a task force to consider musical instrument needs.
- Acted to revise signatures for Mission Endowment accounts and to move local accounts to Union State Bank.
