

Pitched roof and siding storm damage ... soon

The pitched roof, siding, and skylights, which were damaged in the storm last July, will be replaced following the completion of the flat roof. The roof was part of our long-term



plan, and while insurance will not cover the full cost, it will



significantly reduce our future outlays. We expect this to be completed by early June.

New organ ... in and at work!

Thanks to the crew from Rodgers ... and thanks to our folk (Dean Olson, Gary & Linda Berg, Kyle Berg, Jeff & Melissa Haldeman, Eric Ender, and Mike Larson) who assisted with the installation on May 5.

Ceiling tiles ... later this summer

Your continued support ...

of our *Capital Campaign* is vital – the work is getting done, but we still have to "pay the bills." Gifts actually received are about \$50,000 shy of the total needed. So … if you have pledged or not, your continued gifts are critical.

Capital Campaign Update – by, Jan Wee

Many important maintenance and replacement updates to our church are



happening <u>right now</u> thanks to your generosity and support! We are truly a community of disciples striving to provide a safe and welcoming environment for our building.

- The **new digital organ** has been delivered, setup, and Linda Berg and others are learning its wonderful features. Speakers have been installed in the sanctuary, and the dedication of the new organ was May 25/26. Thank you to the volunteers who helped us install the new organ and speakers. Check out the wonderful photos on our website under Resources/Photos. There is also a video available under Resources/Videos.
- *Tuckpointing and caulking* is completed, along with repairing the *base* of our sign out front of the church.
- No doubt you have seen cranes and workers atop our flat roof! We anticipate Ledegar's roofing work being completed by the end of June. Bills will come due, but the final insurance settlement isn't finalized yet.
- The Building Project / Capital Campaign Committee met on May 6 and discussed the budget status. It is likely that we will need to transfer funds from *Endowment Pooled Trust* to cover all the maintenance updates. The shortfall is between \$40-75,000 and is based on the expected insurance settlement and Building Project Capital Campaign giving patterns at this time of year.

Please reaffirm your commitment to support the Building Project. If possible, *please make a payment during the summer months when bills are coming due.* Every dollar helps and is appreciated.

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, May 13, with President Jeff Haldeman presiding.

At this meeting the council:

- Shared in devotion based on 1 Corinthians 15.
- Approved minutes from the April meeting, and received financial reports and pastor's reports.
- Heard that new signage will be installed May 23.
- Received Kelcee Burrell and Dave Hemker as new members, and heard of others in process.
- Heard the Youth Ministry Team met with a number of kids interested in some form of mission trip.
- Discussed the ongoing building work, the parking lot "regravel," and potential work on the rental property roof.
- Amended the rental lease to reflect additional pets.
- Authorized a change in signers for one of the Endowment Pooled Trust accounts.
- Discussed training for a new and expanded counting team.
- Heard an update on Pastor Jon's sabbatical.
- Asked the pastors to prepare a draft for a revised memorial policy.
- Decided to reduce office hours during the first two weeks of July due to vacation times.
- Agreed to participate in the synod-wide "Loggers" game (July 7) and National Night Out (August 6).
- Appointed Graham Sjoquist as an additional youth voting member at the 2024 Synod Assembly.
- Received new policies and procedures for funeral lunches.
- Reviewed the membership list and removed from voting membership a number of persons who have not participated in congregational life in over two years. Noted that if such persons resume participation, they can easily be restored.

Mission Endowment Fund

We continue our series of articles on Endowments, what they are, what they do,

and how they can support the ministry of Our Savior's Mission Endowment Fund in ways that work for you.

U.S. Bonds

U.S. Bonds can be used to fund a life income gift such as a gift annuity. When U.S. bonds are cashed the recipient pays ordinary taxes on the gain in the bonds, which is why so many are never cashed in by seniors. However, by cashing bonds and using the funds to enter an ELCA gift annuity, seniors can use the charitable deduction obtained from the gift annuity to help offset the income taxes from the savings bonds. The best part is that they will then obtain a partly tax-free income for life, and the net result may be far better than if they simply cashed the bonds. If you have U.S. Bonds, consider whether the cash from them may be used to make a gift that returns a life income for you.

A gift annuity can support the ongoing ministry of Our Savior's, or it can support the Mission Endowment Fund, ensuring that those gifts will continue to make a difference for years to come.

As always, it is important to consult a financial professional to see how this might work for you.
