Pastor's Reflections ... Finding God in big and small ways ...

Summer is winding down ... I'm not sure I'm ready for that quite yet. We have returned from vacation –

4,676 miles – having experienced awesome, breathtaking scenery – God's handiwork – across the country. The grandeur of the mountains, reflections on calm waters and crashing waves, rain forests and deserts, waterfalls and trees, the tiniest of insects and the massive bison, sunrises and sunsets that could take your breath away, flowers growing



in lava fields and lush gardens, sunshine and torrential, blinding rain, family and friends. God at work!

While Pastor Jon has been focusing on God at work in the small and the insignificant on his sabbatical, vacation showed us God at work on the big stage.

But God is not at work only in nature and creation, God has been at work here in this place all summer. Five brave souls – *the Spirit was clearly at work in this one!* – worked with Pastor Jon prior to his sabbatical preparing a sermon to be preached in worship. They learned what goes into preparing a sermon, and then experienced actually preaching it. This was truly a blessing for me, as I just had to lead worship. I not only didn't have to prepare a sermon for several weeks, but I got to be fed by their words just like everyone else. And, the best part, seeds were planted and who knows what fruit will be born in the future. God at work!

We continue to get comfortable with our new tech equipment and expand our knowledge, experimenting to see what its capable of doing. We continue to be fed by the music of our new organ and are having fun discovering new possibilities for what it can do. The sidewalks and parking lot have been edged. Work is being done to restore the prayer labyrinth so it can used. God at work!

Along with the obvious "big" projects, lots of "little" projects have been accomplished ... how many can you find? Thank you to all those who have had a hand in caring for this place we call church; this place God has entrusted to us. Your

enthusiasm, energy, thoughtfulness, and work are greatly appreciated. Got at work!
