Pastor's Reflections ... God at work ...

Been a while since I've written a Pastor's Page. Being on sabbatical for the summer months, I missed a bunch of stuff. Now, however, back to it!

For those who haven't heard, it was a good sabbatical. Thank you for that time to refresh and renew, and thanks to Pastor Jean for holding down the fort. But I didn't just take an extra nap here and there. I had a plan for the sabbatical, and for the most part, it worked.

A WORD



My plan was to increase my skills in photography by learning more about "macro" photography. "Macro" sounds big, but it's really about small stuff. Taking pictures of smaller items, or larger items in smaller detail. That included learning to



use a "macro" lens for my camera. In order to keep myself disciplined I decided I would try to take a picture a day. I didn't want to suddenly realize there were only a few weeks left and I hadn't started yet!

To give me some focus (no pun intended) in taking pictures, I decided I would look for where I could see "God at work," especially in the little things around me.

But then, what to do with the pictures, and how to connect back to the congregation? For that, we created a new Facebook page where I could post a picture a day, with a short explanation. You can find it by looking for "Our Savior's ELCA – West Salem." (Thanks for Jaime Fortier

and Carla Burkhardt for help with that, and to Jessalyn Hickey for connecting it to a new Instagram page as well.)

So, how did it work? Fairly well, actually. To be honest, I did not take a picture a day. I did, however, post a picture every day on Facebook. Every day, for 90 days in a row. Like clockwork. And all the pictures were from my sabbatical. No cheating with older pictures!

More importantly, I really worked to keep my eye on where God is at work in our world. That led me to some variety in pictures, but also to some creativity in thought. After all, where can we see God at work in a Japanese beetle or someone wearing a Kermit the Frog shirt, while eating dinner in a place called "Space Aliens" in Bismarck, North Dakota!

And posting on Facebook? I don't know who looked at them, but the "likes" included regular folk, several non-members checking it out, and even a few people we have not seen very much. Yet, on the Facebook page, still connecting with us.



So, as I ponder how I sought out and shared "God at work," maybe God was at work in the project itself. Maybe.

But that's all behind us now. Now what? What's next?

Silly question...God at work in the past, over the summer, to be sure. But God is always at work. Past, present, and future.



And so, it's not really "what's next," but instead, "where next." Where do we see God at work now? No longer in Japanese beetles, or dinners in Bismarck. Not in an intricate spider web or a bumblebee drawing nectar

from a plant. Now it's the harvest about to be gathered and the colors just beginning to burst around us.

God at work, indeed. But also, God at work in...

- the Norwegian Dinner, soon upon us, with all the proceeds going to programs that change lives...
- Bishop Malpica joining us October 19/20, reminding us of our connectedness to others in the body of Christ...
- the organ concert October 13, sharing the joy and wonder of music through instruments and musicians...
- lots of quilts and school kits beginning their journey to meet human needs around the world...
- Bibles already handed to PreK kids in September, and now in October to 3rd graders...

And then, God at work in the many ways we see people connecting with people, in health care and schools, food pantries and homeless shelters, and even in just the simple day to day tasks we carry out as part of our jobs and our



routines. We touch other lives, and in that touching...God is at work...today and in the days to come!

And that's what drives us. The hope that God is still at work, even though sometimes the world seems to be coming apart at the seams.

The coming months will be very uneasy, especially with a tense and contested election coming up. Yet, God is at work. In the midst of the tension, uncertainty, even conflict, we remember and we hold on to the conviction that God is still at work. Even in the most difficult of times. The difficult times in the world around us, and the difficult times in our own journey of life.



Moreover, the God who is at work invites and calls us to join in the work. Remember? God's work, our hands? We do God's work when we reach across the divisions and build relationships with those who are on the other

side. And we do God's work when we proclaim all to be of value, even those who seem to be value-less. And we do God's work when we reach out to uplift the broken and vulnerable. And we do God's work when, in humility, we "let go and let God."

In short, we do God's work when we see how God is at work in our world, we see how we are a part of that work, and we let the crucified Christ work through us. In the big moments that dramatically change the world, and in the small ways that change our little corner of God's creation.

Feed Our Children Summer Lunch Program

We are once again all cleaned up for the season. I want to send out a huge thank you to all of the members of our congregation who have made this season's Summer Lunch Program

possible. Many of you volunteered your time preparing, serving or delivering. Many of our most needed item donations came from our congregation and that really helps keep our overall costs down quite a bit. As we all know, prices for many things are much higher than they have been in the past.

Large donations came from Hansen's IGA, West Salem Schools, Linda's Bakery, Compeer Financial, Marine Credit Union, and many memorials and individuals. We also applied for and received a significant grant from Kwik Trip this year which was milk for lunches and breakfasts for several weeks. The Community Care and Share Food Pantry, and a Thrivent grant written by Lynette Ender provided bags of meal items for all of our pickups and deliveries.

This year we had eight weekly leaders: from Our Savior's – Lynette Ender (also representing the West Salem Lions), Carla Burkhardt, Judy & Phil Gilbert, and Tracy Hesse and myself (also representing the School District of West Salem) ... from St. Teresa's of Kolkata – Cheryl Lang ... from Prince of Peace – Sherie Brunk ... and from West Salem Presbyterian Church – Nick Miller. Their help in organizing a week or two of volunteers is very helpful. Connie Pinski shared her Thrivent grant with us and shopped for produce several weeks in a row.

I was invited to attend a spring LaCrosse County food insecurity meeting again this year. Various organizations were represented at that meeting including the Food Pantry – West Salem was well represented. One of the goals of this year was making sure that fresh fruits and vegetables are offered for every meal. We did our part and were able to do this through various donations and our amazing volunteers. It was also highlighted at this meeting that one of the ways that we specifically make a big difference is by partnering with the Boys and Girls Club of West Salem. They provide structured and supervised activities throughout the summer. Nothing that we send there is wasted ... if there are ever any leftovers, they are used the next day.

Leonard St entrance lighting ... completed last fall! The new lighting allows for safe entry and exit when it's dark.

Tuckpointing and caulking ... completed in May! Can't really see it, but it's critical to maintain the health of the building.



Flat roof ... completed in June! A new roof to keep us dry for the next 20+ years. No more leaks to watch for!

Pitched roof and siding storm damage ... completed in July! The pitched roof, siding on the steeple, and the skylights, have all

been repaired. A new roof for the next 30+ years.



New organ ... completed in May!

Great sound and flexibility. This organ allows for remote operation, and can be tailored to the abilities of the musician. We'll show it off at the concert on October 13. Join us!

Ceiling tiles ... completed in August! No more stains – and a new bright white feel to the Gathering Area. Thank you to everyone who contributed to the tile promotion – and to the work crew that installed the tiles – we did this job by ourselves! We'll acknowledge memorials in the future!

Parking lot ... re-graveling completed in July! We're not ready to pave the new and repave the old parking lot, but for the moment a new and greatly improved gravel job puts the parking lot in good shape.

Coming next month ...

an update on the capital campaign which is making these improvements possible.

Meanwhile ... **Your continued support** is vital – the work is done, but we still have to "pay the bills."



Mission Endowment Fund



A continuing series of articles on endowments, what they are, what they do, and how they can support the ministry of Our Savior's Mission Endowment Fund in ways that work for you.

U.S. Bonds

Deferred Charitable Gift Annuities are a way for middleaged and older persons to plan gifts to ministries, including Our Savior's, while providing themselves with a future life income. The longer one can defer the payout from a gift annuity, the higher the resulting income percent for the life of the donor(s). Further, an income tax deduction is received when the deferred gift annuity is entered, and a significant portion of the annual income from the annuity is received tax-free when payments begin. If the intent to make a gift exists, when compared with the historical rates of return of fixed investments (and indeed the current fixed investment rates), deferred gift annuities represent a significant opportunity for future life income.

As always, consult a tax professional to understand the opportunities and implications of any financial tool.
