Pastor's Reflections ... God at work ...

Have you ever felt overwhelmed, overworked, not enough hours in the day, too many things to keep track of, your head is spinning and you don't seem to be accomplishing anything despite always being busy? That was culminating for me yesterday ... and then I was supposed to go on a hike ... who had time? who had the energy? ... But the weather was perfect, a beautiful crisp fall

day, with a few leaves still on the trees allowing their colors to shine through, and a group of people gathering to have conversation. And, God was at work ... in the people, in nature, in me.

God Is at Work

Got at work ... the theme of Pastor Jon's sabbatical project. He took hundreds of pictures of God at work here in our own backyard and neighborhood, and across the country. But those are the obvious places ... what about the more subtle, not so obvious places?

Life is not easy, we experience bumps and bruises along the way, sometimes even potholes that consume us, but we have faith and trust that God is at work in the promise made at our baptism to be with us through it all, no matter what comes.

- ... when we are grieving the loss of loved ones, God is at work in those who surround us with their love and care.
- ... when we are struggling with health issues, God is at work in the healthcare professionals who treat us and care for us.

- ... when we are feeling lonely or lost, God is at work as people are placed in our path who take the time to walk with us.
- ... when we are marginalized and vulnerable, God is at work in those we encounter who treat us with respect and dignity.
- ... when life is dark, God is at work bringing us light.
- ... when we need quiet time, time for self-care, God is at work in the moment, in the silence, in the giving of permission to just be.

We find ourselves in a world that is hurting, that can't seem to get along, that struggles to find common ground and chooses not to try. Yet, God is at work in us. God is at work in us as we are called to make a difference in the lives of others. We are called to accept and



welcome others, even if they aren't like us, even if they disagree with us, even if we don't particularly like them. It would be so easy to turn ourselves inward, surround ourselves only with those who mirror us in all that we say and do. But that's not what God calls us to do.




As we move forward in the days and weeks to come, wherever we find ourselves, whatever the circumstances, remember that God is at work, in those around us and in ourselves.

Wednesday, November 6, the sanctuary will be available from 9 AM to 7 PM for quiet prayer. Hungry Jar Offering for November – Our Savior's LaCrosse Come for Supper Ministry



Come for Supper (CFS) is a response to Jesus' call to care for our neighbors by providing nutritious free meals served with generosity and love. CFS began as a reaction to the spiritual command to love our neighbors as well as taking an initiative concerning the problems of poverty and hunger in the La Crosse community. The first CFS meal was served Tuesday, December 3, 1996. Thirty-five guests arrived that first night. Today, CFS serves 225-250 people every Tuesday.

The program has grown, and today Our Savior's supports a consistent flow of individuals experiencing homelessness, with some attending Come for Supper, others seeking refuge from the rain, and some finding rest near their entrance. They offer assistance within their means and capabilities.

Building Projects (Financial) Update

The building work is done! Front entrance lighting, tuckpointing and caulking, roof work, parking lot gravel, and other storm damage, and the new organ. All in place!

But now ... got to pay the bill!

So, how is that going? In order to be transparent ...

BALANCE NEEDED: \$ 65,508

Note that there will be a supplemental insurance payout, but we do not yet know that amount. We expect it to cover close to one-third of the balance needed, but that still leaves us with a "chunk of change" yet to go.

- Received updates on the building projects and the challenges with renewing property insurance.
- Discussed the stewardship emphasis for the fall.
- Finalized plans for the upcoming visit of Bishop Malpica.
- Discussed need to recruit extra counters for the counting team.
- Reviewed and adopted a revised Gift and Memorial Policy.
- Decided to proceed with a new photo directory, with pictures taken during the first half of 2025.
- Received an explanation of the original intent of the "bequest funds." Decided to combine several restricted funds and remove "bequest funds" from the names.
- Approved purchase of a larger monitor for the Gathering Area.
- Discussed the nomination process for 2025.
- Heard that Jacob Iliff is transferring to Peace Lutheran Church, Green Bay.
