READING Hebrews 10:5-10



God our beacon, as the northern hemisphere begins its slow turn toward more daylight, remind us that even in the deepest nights, you are there. Comfort the lonely and bereaved. Hold closely the frightened, anxious, depressed, and ill. Accompany those who are isolated, alone, or homebound, especially Cristi and Luella. Lord, in your mercy,

receive our prayer.

God our guide, shepherd the leadership of this congregation. Bless the council and staff in discerning future ministry and open their hearts to the voices of the community. Lord, in your mercy, receive our prayer. God our teacher, we pray for your servants to be faithful disciples of Jesus. 
Lift up your hearts.


